Merit Badges



- **\$40 per scout**

- **Electricity Pre-Requisite: 2. (use the checklist on the next page)**
- **Electronics Pre-Requisite: 6.**

Cords & Plugs

- No exposed wire or fraying in cords and cables
- No extension cords under carpets or through door thresholds
- No use of an extension cord as a permanent fixture (excepting surge protectors)
- No plugs left partially inserted
- No damaged plug casings
- Major appliances (eg: washers, dryers, fridges, stoves, etc) plugged directly into outlets
- Cords away from moisture sources

Lighting

- All lightbulbs are at or below the fixtures' rated maximum wattage
- Light fixtures are secure and away from highly flammable materials

Appliances

- Heat-producing appliances (eg: toasters, heaters, coffeemakers) kept away from highly flammable goods or materials
- Stove vent hood free of grease or lint
- No portable heater being used in a bathroom or washroom
- All portable heaters, if any, certified by a testing organization such as UL
- Dryer lint trap and exhaust free of obstructions and not filled with excessive amounts of lint

Additional Safety Considerations



- GFCI outlets in use in all bathrooms
- Any AFCI breakers or GFCI outlets or breakers have been tested within the past month
- No outlets are warm to the touch, or have visible burn marks or other damage
- No lights are unusually/inexplicably dim or regularly flicker unrelated to local weather
- Electrical breaker panel free of obstructions or visible damage

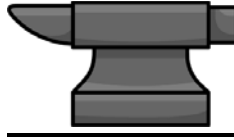
